NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Nature of Activities

The Silver Star Families of America (the Organization) was organized to provide free services to the wounded members of the Armed forces, including, but not limited to presentation of a Silver Star Barmer and certificate. The Organization's mission is to also act as an advocate for the Wounded and to educate the public on the pight of the wounded.

The Organization collects donated materials used to provide care packages to the wounded as well as to various military and V.A. hospitals.

Basis of Accounting

Revenues and expenditures are recognized on the accrual basis of accounting. Under the accrual basis of accounting, revenues are recorded when both messurable and available. Expenditures under the accrual basis of accounting are recorded when the liability is incurred.

Einancial Statement Presentation

The Organization has adopted Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) 117, "Financial Statements of Not-for-Profit Organizations." Under SFAS 117, the Organization reports information reporting its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets, and their restricted or unrestricted nature, as follows:

Unrestricted Temporarily Restricted Permanently Unrestricted

Carries no donor restriction Time or purpose restriction Permanent donor restriction

Also under SFAS 117, the Organization is required to present a statement of cash flows.

In accordance with SFAS 117, all expenses are reported in the unrestricted net asset class. As restrictions are met, reclassification entries are made to move net assets from the temporarily restricted class to the unrestricted class so that the expenditures may be made within that asset class. At December 31, 2006, there were no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets.

Donated Materials

The Organization collects donated materials used to provide care packages to the wounded as well as to various military and V.A. hospitals. Those donations have been recorded in the financial statements as intend contributions on the statement of activities in accordance with Statement of Financial Accounting Standards (SFAS) 116, "Accounting for Contributions Received and Contributions Made."

Tax-Exempt Status

The Siver Star Families of America qualifies as a law-exempt organization under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code.

Use of Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and declosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates, and that difference may be material.
